Gift IDEAS

- ✓ **SOMETHING TO WEAR:** t-shirt, polo shirt, shorts, skirt, cap, beanie, sandals, etc.
- ✓ **SOMETHING TO LOVE:** teddy bear, doll, soft toy, etc.
- ✓ **SOMETHING SPECIAL:** carry bag, sunglasses, bangles, stickers, necklaces, craft kits, a personal note, a photo of yourself, etc.
- ✓ **SOME THINGS FOR SCHOOL:** exercise book, pencil case, pens, pencils, colouring pencils, sharpener, eraser, chalk, etc.
- ✓ **SOMETHING TO PLAY WITH:** tennis ball, cars, skipping rope, marbles, musical instrument, yo-yo, slinky, finger puppets, wind-up torch, etc.
- ✓ **SOMETHING FOR PERSONAL HYGIENE:** soap and face washer, toothbrush, hairbrush, comb, scrunchies, hair-clips, etc.

Prohibited ITEMS*

- ✗ **ANY USED OR DAMAGED ITEMS:** (due to customs regulations) including worn clothing and old toys
- ✗ **ANY BREAKABLE ITEMS:** including glass, porcelain and mirrors
- ✗ **ANY ITEM THAT CAN SCARE OR HARM A CHILD:** including knives, war-related toys and toy guns
- ✗ **ANY GAMBLING-RELATED ITEMS:** including play money, playing cards and dominoes
- ✗ **ANYTHING OF A RELIGIOUS, RACIAL OR POLITICAL NATURE**
